1 Samuel 17:1 NIV

Saul and the Israelites assembled and camped in the Valley of Elah and drew up their battle line to meet the Philistines.

1 Samuel 17:2 NIV

The Philistines occupied one hill
and the Israelites another, with the
valley between them.

1 Samuel 17:3 NIV

A champion named **Goliath**, who was from Gath, came out of the Philistine camp. His height was six cubits and a span.

1 Samuel 17:4 NIV

He had a bronze helmet on his head and wore a coat of scale armor of bronze weighing five thousand shekels; on his legs he wore bronze greaves, and a bronze javelin was slung on his back.

1 Samuel 17:5-6 NIV

His spear shaft was like a weaver's rod, and its iron point weighed six hundred shekels. His shield bearer went ahead of him.

1 Samuel 17:7 NIV

Goliath stood and shouted to the ranks of Israel, “Why do you come out and line up for battle? Am I not a Philistine, and are you not the servants of Saul? Choose a man and have him come down to me.

1 Samuel 17:8 NIV

If he is able to fight and kill me, we will become your subjects; but if I overcome him and kill him, you will become our subjects and serve us.”

1 Samuel 17:9 NIV

On **hearing** the Philistine's words,
Saul and all the Israelites were
dismayed and terrified.

1 Samuel 17:10 NIV

For forty days the Philistine came forward **every morning and evening** and took his stand.

1 Samuel 17:16 NIV

As he was talking with them, Goliath, the Philistine champion from Gath, stepped out from his lines and shouted his usual defiance, and David **heard it**. Whenever the Israelites **saw** the man, they all **fled** from him in great fear.

1 Samuel 17:23-24 NIV

David asked the men standing near him, “What will be done for the man who kills this Philistine and removes this **disgrace** from Israel? **Who** is this uncircumcised Philistine that he should defy the armies of **the living God?**”

1 Samuel 17:26 NIV

...“Why have you come down here?
And with whom did you leave those
few sheep in the wilderness? I know
how conceited you are and how
wicked your heart is; you came
down only to watch the battle.”

1 Samuel 17:28 NIV

What David said was overheard and reported to Saul, and Saul sent for him. David said to Saul, “Let no one lose heart on account of this Philistine; your servant will go and fight him.”

1 Samuel 17:31-32 NIV

Saul replied, “You are not able to go out against this Philistine and fight him; you are only a young man, and he has been a warrior from his youth.” But David said to Saul...

1 Samuel 17:33-34 NIV

Your servant has killed both the lion and the bear; this uncircumcised Philistine **will be** like one of them, because he has defied the armies of the living God.

1 Samuel 17:36 NIV

The Lord who rescued me from the paw of the lion and the paw of the bear will rescue me from the hand of this Philistine.”

1 Samuel 17:37 NIV

Allow your *past victories*
to fuel your *future vision*.

So David triumphed over the Philistine with a sling and a stone; without a sword in his hand he struck down the Philistine and killed him.
