God came to **John** son of

all the people of Jerusalem went
out to him...

The people were waiting expectantly and were all **wondering** in their hearts if **John** might possibly be the **Messiah**.

also for the **scattered** children of
God, to bring them together and
make them **one**.

So from that day on they plotted to

John 11:53 NIV

For whoever wants to save their life will **lose it**, but whoever loses their life for me will **find it**.

Matthew 16:25 NIV

What good will it be for someone to gain the **whole world**, yet **forfeit** their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul?

Matthew 16:26 NIV

When you live for the important things but resist the most important thing, you will forfeit everything in the end.
